# A Royal History

Visit The Savill Garden and you will be connecting with Royal history from the original Weeping Willow tree that still stands today to many others including:

- The award-winning Queen Elizabeth Temperate House opened by Queen Elizabeth II in 1995
- The Golden Jubilee Garden – This modern representation of the much-loved cottage garden was opened by Elizabeth II in July 2002
- The Rose Garden opened by Elizabeth II in July 2010. You will enjoy the intensity of the colours and the perfumes as you weave your way to the centre of the garden to a walkway that treats you to a very different view of this spectacular setting
- The New Zealand Garden – Uses native plants gifted to Elizabeth II from a state visit in 1986. The garden was re-designed in 2006 and opened by The Duke of York in April 2007

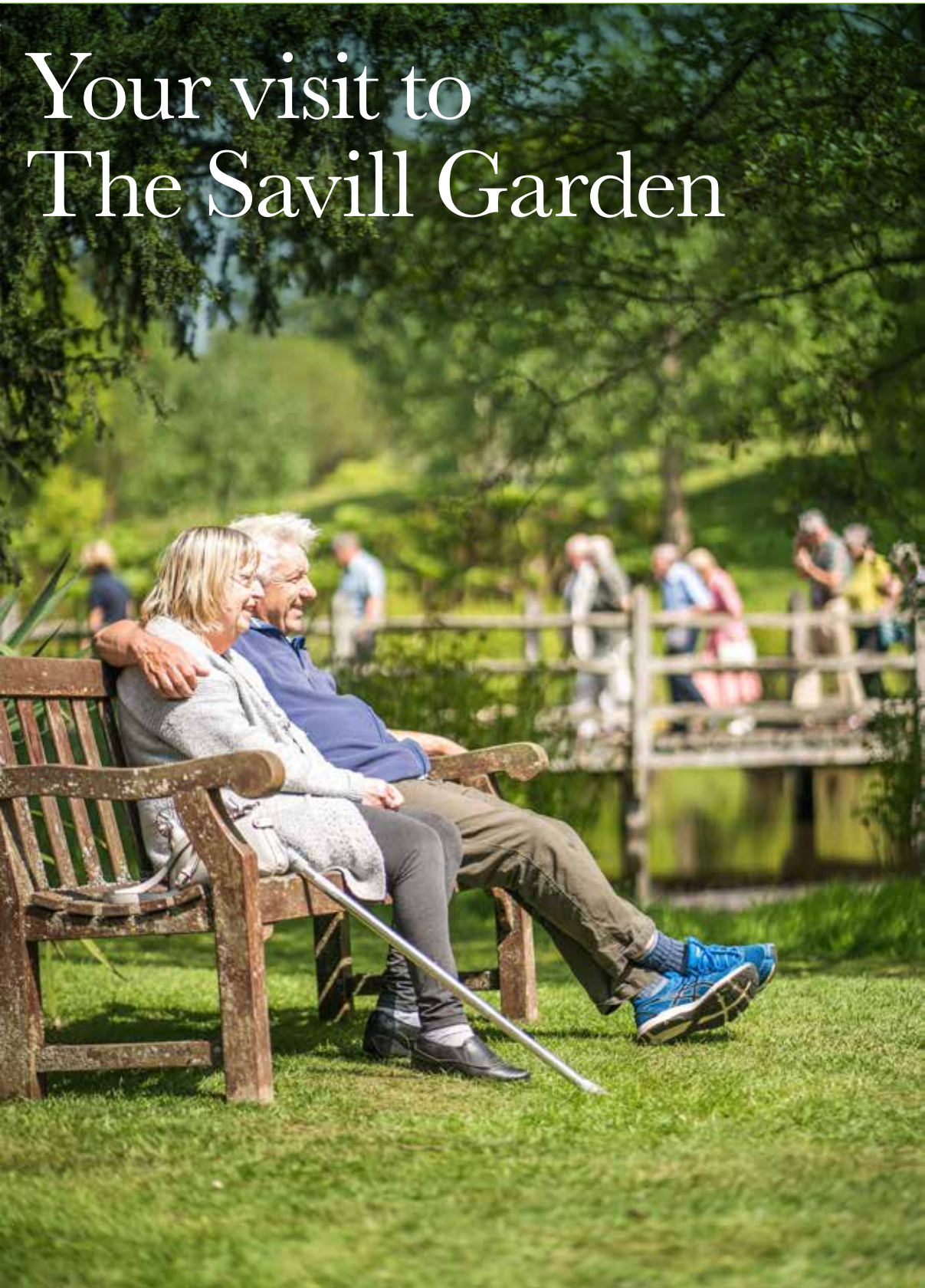

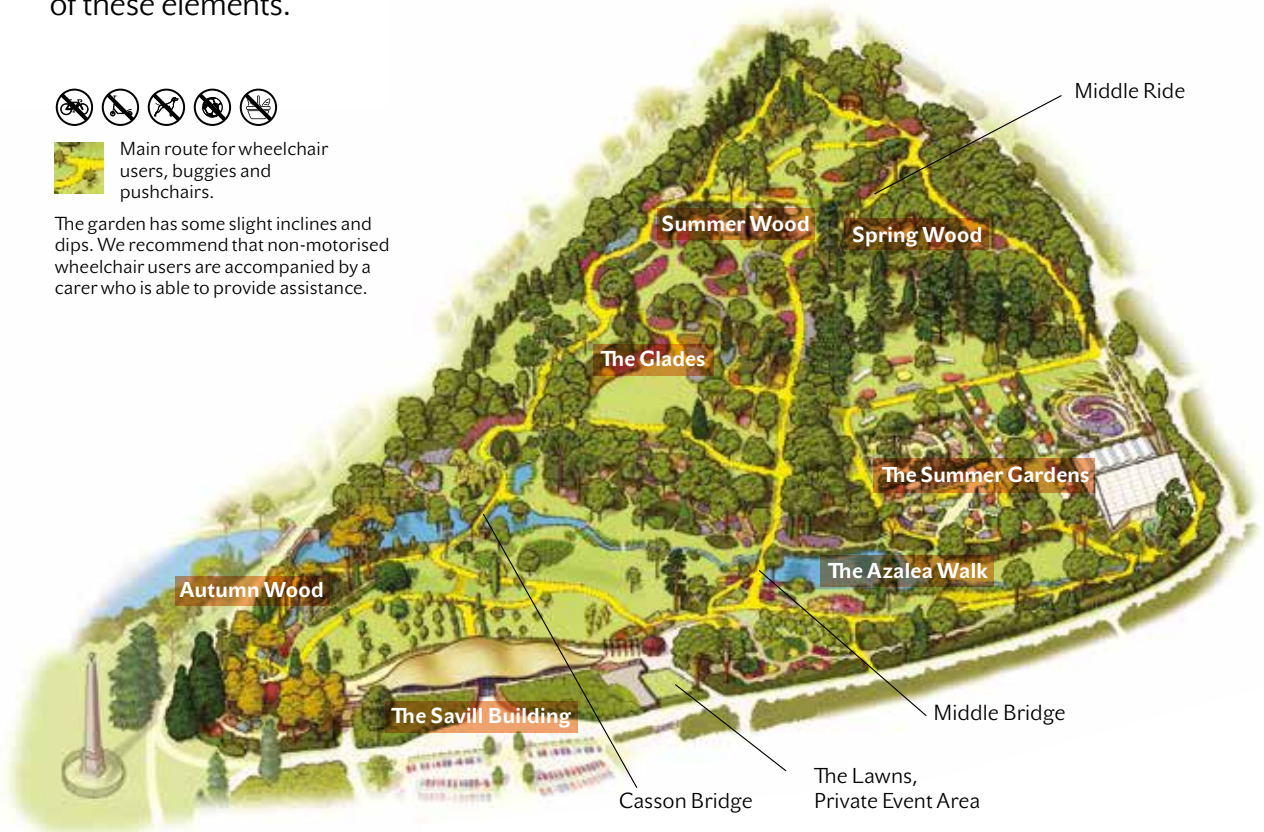
The Savill Garden has earned its reputation as one of the finest woodland gardens in the country – not because it is the biggest woodland garden or that it has the largest collection of plants, but for a combination of all of these elements.

Its ability to keep adapting to its landscape environment provide a great balance of design, colour and texture. Visit throughout the seasons and you will see there is always something new to discover.

### June

- The borders are a wonderful display of seasonality with old fashioned scented French musk roses inter-planted with a wide range of shrubs and perennials
- The Dry Garden, the first of its kind in the UK has been planted with a Mediterranean feel including great swathes of South African Angel's Fishing Rod's, many of which are noted for their silver foliage and herbal scents.

- Lose yourself amongst the many delicate soothing colours of the beautifully designed Golden Jubilee Garden, designed for the 50th anniversary of the accession of Queen Elizabeth II in 2002
- Take in the scent of the contemporary Rose Garden with its viewing platform that looks over the roses as well as the garden beyond

Japanese Maples, Sweetgums, Hickories and Tupelo trees set the gardens alight with a pallet of colours. Beneath the canopies of the large trees, autumn bulbs of the colchicum, cyclamen and crocus emerge to put on subtle displays of colour. Autumn is also a time when many birds come to the Garden to feed on seeds and fruits of a huge range of plants, especially the Mountain Ash, Hollies and grasses in the Dry Garden.

## Accessibility

The team at The Savill Garden will do everything they can to ensure that you enjoy your visit. If you feel that it would be useful to contact us in advance of a visit to discuss specific access requirements please do so.

Both the Visitor Centre and the Garden offer good accessibility for visitors with a disability:

- Accessible parking is situated outside the Visitor Centre
- There is a flat level walk from the coach/car park to the Visitor Centre
- There are good all-weather paths around the Garden allowing access for all wheelchair users.

- The Garden has some slight inclines and dips. We would recommend that you consider travelling with a carer who is able to assist when using a non-motorised wheelchair
- A limited number of non-motorised wheelchairs are available on a first come, first served basis
- Assistance dogs are welcome
- Accessible toilets are available in the Visitor Centre

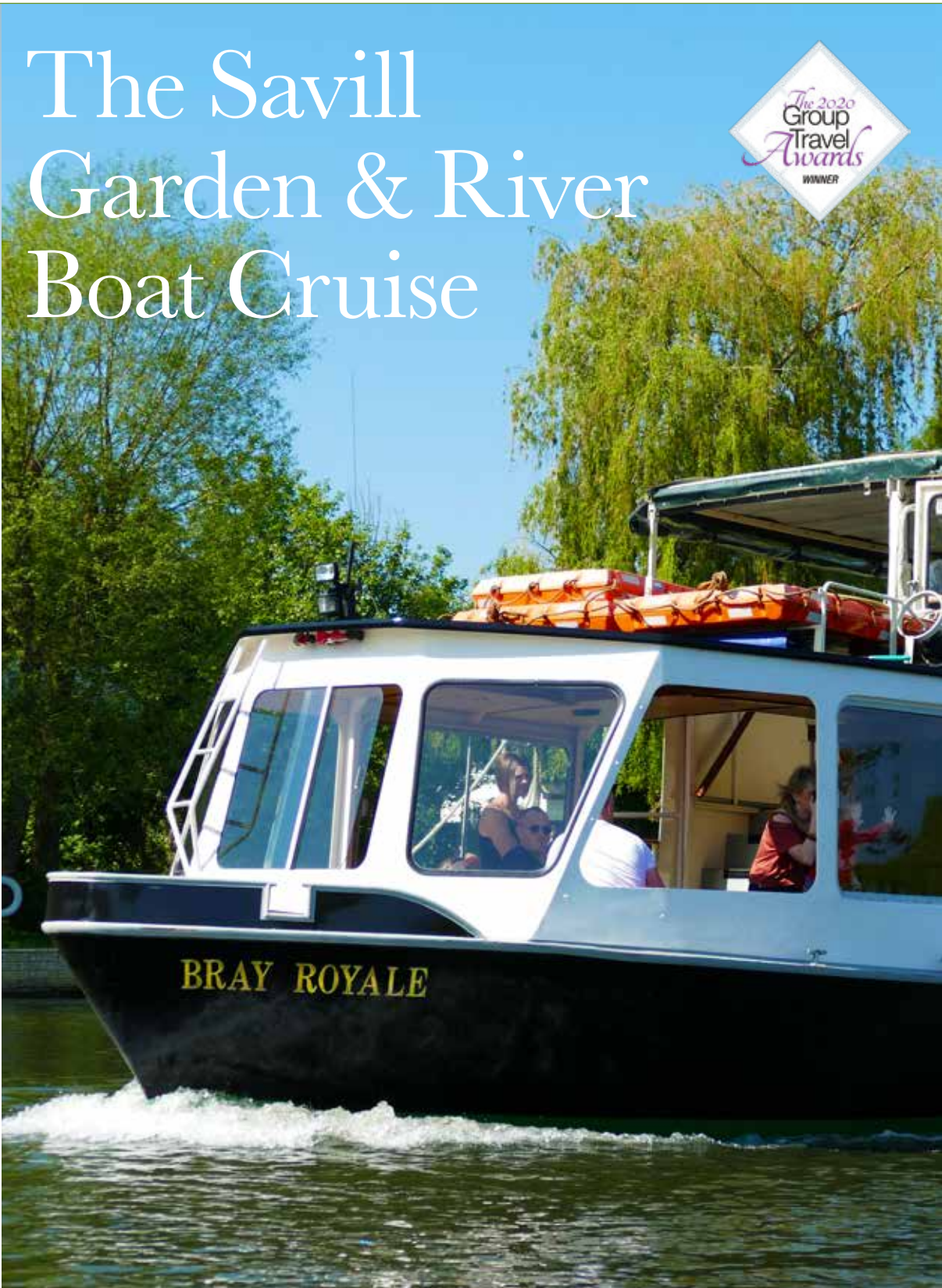

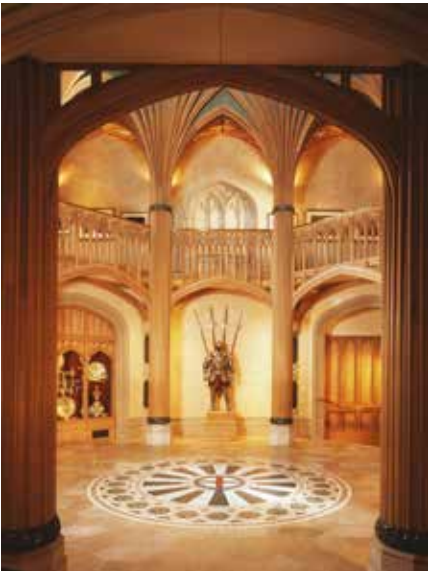


# Windsor Castle & The Savill Garden

One of the official residences of His Majesty The King, Windsor Castle is the largest and oldest occupied castle in the world. Within the Castle Precincts you will discover St George’s Chapel, the spiritual home of the Order of the Garter - one of the oldest orders of chivalry.

The castle has been the home of 39 monarchs, and the appearance of the State Apartments today reflects the changing tastes of the Castle’s Royal occupants, particularly Charles III (r.1660-85) and George IV (r.1820-30). With painted ceilings by Antonion Verrio, and carvings by Grinling Gibbons, the State Apartments are a ‘must see’ on your visit.
